# Get Ready: Before you start

- Order your Student ID Card

## Money matters

- Check your fee due dates in eCentral and make sure you pay on time
- Find out if you are eligible for a payment plan and if so, how to apply by the deadline

## Get to know your online world

### Your Gordon username

Your Gordon email address is your username (eg. 2007237@gordontafe.edu.au). This is your login to Gordon systems including eCentral, GordonOnline, CareerHub and Wi-Fi on campus.

### eCentral

Manage your personal information, including applications and enrolment. Use eCentral via the Student Portal to:

- update your personal details
- apply for courses and view your application status and any correspondence
- manage your enrolment and view your results
- find out due dates and pay fees
- apply for scholarships.

### Gordon Online

Gordon Online is where you'll find course materials and assessment details. You will often need to submit or upload assignments through here.

An app is available if you would like to access GordonOnline on a mobile device.

## Student Rights and Responsibilities

### Student Code of Conduct

The expected behaviour of all students includes:

- taking responsibility for your learning
- contributing to a healthy and safe learning environment
- respecting yourself, others and your learning environment
- complying with the Educational Services for Overseas Students (ESOS) Act and the National Code 2018 (for international students who are studying on a student visa)

### Personal Learning Requirements

Personal Learning Requirements outline the skills and capabilities you need for a course. Details of these can be found in the course Entrance Requirements.

### Feedback and Complaints

Your voice matters, if you have feedback we would love to hear it. Go to Student Voice in the Student Portal to find out how to share your thoughts.

### Smoking, Alcohol and other drugs

The Gordon is a smoke-free environment; no smoking, vaping, or tobacco is allowed on campuses, property, or vehicles controlled by The Gordon.

Being under the influence of alcohol or drugs at The Gordon or during any on or off-campus Gordon activities is prohibited and may lead to disciplinary action.

### Plagiarism

In essays or research projects, you are expected to use information from various trusted sources as well as your own ideas. You must always cite other's work, failure to do so may lead to project failure.

### Referencing

Referencing prevents plagiarism by crediting the information you use, supporting your ideas. It also supports your ideas by demonstrating that you have used reliable and credible sources.

# Student Leadership

Being a Student Ambassador or having another student leadership role helps build your professional connections, make new friends, and build or enhance your professional skills and employability.



## **The Gordon's responsibilities to students**

If an unaccompanied animal is found on campus please contact Gordon Security.

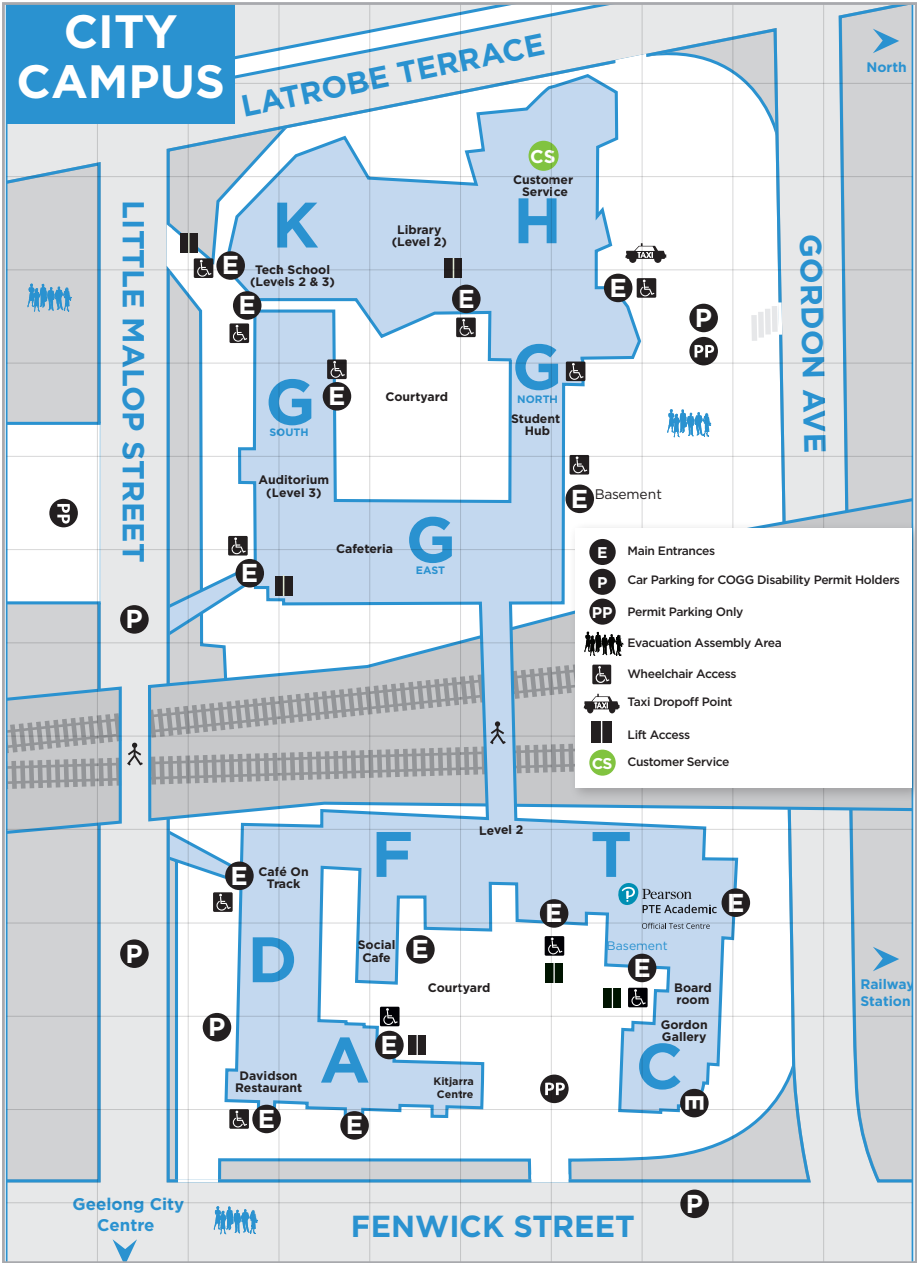
## Children on campus
