The skills and abilities required to study in this course include:

Communication Skills

- Ability to listen to and reflect on feedback from teachers
- Demonstrate clear written communication skills (e.g. to be able to complete assessments)
- Listen actively (e.g. to understand classroom instructions and discussions)
- Read, understand and respond to, verbal and non-verbal cues and communication accurately and appropriately (e.g. body language)

Physical Skills

- Capacity to use computers/smart devices
- Fine and gross motor skills depending on electives that are studied (e.g. if you study Outdoor and Environmental Studies you may be walking, squatting, kneeling and using equipment in the field)

Cognitive Skills

- Ability to learn course material and process information to complete assessments
- Ability to participate in classroom activities
- Ability to perform calculations and follow instructions for problem-solving (if you wish to study Mathematics)
- Ability to read complex texts and collect information from texts
- Ability to write several paragraphs

Behavioural & Social Skills

- Ability to remain alert, focused and engaged in the classroom
- Ability to work as part of a team
- Be responsible for self and others' health and safety
- You can pay attention in class and join classroom discussions
- You can work with other people

Technical Skills

 You can use a computer to search the internet, read websites, watch and listen to videos, write and send an email and write information

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Digital Skills

- Understands extremely familiar digital terminology, e.g. turn computer on
- Able to use a desktop icon to open extremely familiar software program
- Able to scan a QR Code
- Able to enter your full name on digital form
- Able to recognise a mobile phone, computer, tablet
- Able to turn a tablet/computer on or off
- Able to answer a phone call from trainer
- Able to copy a generic password on a computer, e.g. GUEST1



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- Able to follow extremely simple instruction and demonstration to turn phone on and off
- Begins to use computer mouse with single left click
